Roper Gulf Regional Council will open Round 2 of its Community Grants Program on Tuesday 11 April 2023 at 9:00am.

This will be the second round of community grant funding for the 2022-2023 financial year, with \$30,000 of funding available.

Community groups, organisations and individuals are invited to apply for grant funding of up to \$5,000 each to support local community projects.

The purpose of the grants program is to encourage and support community initiatives that respond to local needs, enhance community wellbeing, culture, reconciliation and quality of life and are of benefit to residents of the Roper Gulf region.
